

Year 9 (Term courses)

Our program dedicated to Year 9 students is designed to accompany high school students who started learning French in Year 7 and continued to learn French throughout Year 8 at high school.

After-school courses are held every Term at our school in St Kilda or in the CBD. It is important that every student enrolled in Term 1 re-enroll in Terms 2, 3 and 4 in order to progress through the textbooks.

The textbooks that are used to support our Year 9 program include both class-based activities and online resources. The pace is deliberately slower than in any other course to make sure students build a strong understanding and appreciation of the language.
